

## MEN AND THE CHURCH

Acts 17:12, "Many believed...of honorable women... and of men not a few."

"Four things in any land must dwell,  
If it endures and prospers well:  
One is manhood true and good;  
One is noble womanhood;  
One is child life, clean and bright;  
And one an altar kept alight."

III. Notice, however, the place of men in the early church,

A. The response of men to the gospel message.

1. Women had no monopoly on Xtn religion.

2. Probably, then as today, men were outnumbered by women; but they still made up a large part of every congregation. But the laymen were certainly NOT in a conspicuously small majority.

B. Why men need the church.

1. To find Forgiveness of sin

2. To find fellowship that inspires.

a. Fellowship with God.

In a negro sermon on the Creation it is imagined:

"Ang God, stepped out on space,  
And He looked around and said:  
I'm lonely--

I'll make me a world." Just how you do make your world?

After vividly describing how God created the world, light, green grass, the lakes and rivers, dog si and fish and fowls and beasts and birds, the poet continues:

"Then God walked around, in His visit set all above His head.  
And God looked around  
On all that He had made...  
And God said: I'm lonely still. No one else could ever fill.

Then God sat down--  
On the side of a hill where He could think;  
By a deep, wide river He sat down;  
With His head in His hands,  
God thought and thought,  
Till He thought: I'll make me a man!

Up from the bed of the river, straight (written in red ink) S  
God scooped the clay;  
And by the bank of the river  
He kneeled Him down; (written in red ink) and enveloped (written in red ink) H  
And there the great God Almighty...  
~~Like a mammy bending over her baby,~~ (written in red ink) H  
Kneeled down in the dust (written in red ink) and no violence on her mother. H  
Toiling over a lump of clay (written in red ink) gladdish. S  
Till He shaped it in His own image; (written in red ink) and the sun  
Then into it He blew the breath of life, (written in red ink) in the morning  
And man became a living soul. (written in red ink) From lifelessness to life  
Amen. Amen."

- b. Men also needs the church  
To find Fellowship with other Christian men.
- 3. Men needs the church, moreover, to find Food that strengthens the spirit.  
see v. 11, they "searched the scriptures"
- 4. To find a Force that is multiplied in masculine unity.

Often man's genius is wasted in wrong directions.  
Our towers rise; we prosper while we may,  
Grown drunken with the wine of loss and gain,  
Nor fearful lest we haply rear in vain  
A brazen idol upon feet of clay."

#### C. Why the Church Needs Men

- 1. To be the Head of a Christian Home and spiritual example & counsellor in the family.  
"Give us Men!"  
Men who, when the tempest gathers,  
Grasp the standard of their fathers  
in the thickest fight:  
Men who strike for home and altar,  
True as truth the lorn and lonely,  
Tender, as the brave are only;  
Men who tread where saints have trod,  
Men for Country, Home--and God:  
Give us Men! I say again--again--  
Give us Men!!"

- 2. To lead other men to Christ & to live for Christ.  
"God send us men whose aim 'twill be,  
Not to defend some outworn creed,  
But to live out the laws of Christ  
In every thought and word and deed."
- 3. To do the work in the church that only men can do  
& to encourage and help the ladies & children in their part of the Lord's work.

4. The church needs men To Undergird the Stewardship Program of the church in carrying out the Great Commission.

a. "I love thy Church, O God;  
For her my tears shall fall,  
For her my prayers ascend;  
To her my cares & toils be given,  
Till toils and cares shall end."

b. People wonder how the church can sleep soundly amidst the burning problems and issues that face us today. The church has never become aggressive and militant with a positive forward program until the laymen are revived and actively participating in and supporting its ministry.
