I. The Shadow of Human Frailty

1. The Shadow of Egypt, Isa. 30:2, "Woe to the rebellious children, saith the Lord, that walk to go down into Egypt, and have not asked at my mouth; to strengthen themselves in the strength of Pharaoh, and to trust in the shadow of Egypt!"

His days are as a shadow that passeth away."

3. I Chron. 29:15, "For we are strangers before thee, and sojourners, as were all our fathers; our days on earth are as a shadow, and there is none abiding."

✓ III. The Shadow of Divine Protection

1. Under the SHADOW OF HIS WINGS

A. Ps. 17:8, "Keep me as the apple of the eye,
hide me under the SHADOW of thy wings."

B. Ps. 36:7, "How excellent is thy lovingkindness, O God
therefore the children of men put their trust
under the SHADOW of thy wings."

2. There are many shadows that fall across the earth -- the shadows of floating clouds, of trees swaying in the wind, of smoke ascending from chimneys, of birds on the wing,

and the shadows of great rocks on mountainsides.
But the deepest and longest and kindest shadow
which falls over the earth is
the SHADOW OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE.

and made me a polished shaft."

4. The SHADOW OF DIVINE GUIDANCE.

Isa. 51:16, "I have put my words in thy mouth,
and I have covered thee in the SHADOW of my hand."

IV. THE SHADOW OF HEAVENLY THINGS, Heb. 8:5 (A. Rope quote)

1. The O.T. priests, gifts, offerings, & sacrifices
were shadows of heavenly things realized in Christ

2. Present blessings are shadows of future blessings.

3. The Law was a shadow of good things to come, Heb. 10:1

A. Yet it could "never with those sacrifices which
they offered year by year continually make, the ^{comes} ~~come~~
thereunto perfect." (For it is not possible that
the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sin
v. 4)

B. "But this man (Jesus Christ), after he had offered

C. Experience of Dr. Joseph Cook, of Boston, at a
great parliament of religions, held at Chicago
many years ago. Practically every known religion
was represented, and many learned discourses
were delivered.

During the session, Dr. Cook rose and said:
"Gentlemen, I beg to introduce to you a woman with a
great sorrow.
Bloodstains are on her hands and nothing she has tried
will remove them.

The blood is that of murder,
and nothing will take away the stain.
She has been driven to desperation in her distress.
Is there anything in your religion
that will remove her sin and give her peace?"

A hush fell upon the gathering as the speaker turned
from one to another for an answer.

Not one of the company replied.

Raising his eyes heavenwards, Dr. Cook then cried out
"I will ask another.

John, can YOU tell this woman how to get rid of her sin?"

The great preacher waited,
as if listening for a reply.

Suddenly he cried, "Listen. John speaks:

"The blood of Jesus Christ, His Son,
cleanseth us from all sin!" (I John 1:7)

Not a soul broke the silence:
the representatives of eastern religions and western
cults sat dumb.

In the face of human need, they were without message
or hope.

The gospel of Jesus Christ alone could meet the need.
The sin of the race demanded the blood of Calvary.

PS 91, a triumphant song of praise

This psalm reminds us in many ways of ps. 90.

Both begin with the blessedness of those who find a dwelling place in God.

But here the tone is more confident.

The faith rises on easy wings and sings spontaneously.

Ps. 90 suggests a man of many years who has experienced disappointments and frustrations.

Ps. 91 suggests a young man with bouyancy and expectancy.

His praise is of one whose hope is rooted in God.

He knows that life has many perils:

the fowler's snare,

the pit of destruction,

the terror by night,

the arrow that flieth by day.

Yet his mind is not obsessed by these things but by the security of those who dwell in the secret place of the Most High.

The emphasis falls not on those who pay occasional visits, but on those who dwell--who abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

Additional notes:

I. In contrast with the Lord of hosts,
how frail is even the strongest of men!
His days are like a passing shadow.
He may gain knowledge that gives him
some pre-eminence;

he may be granted fullness of days,
and the respect of his contemporaries;
he may be loaded with earthly dignities, but
"The boast of heraldry, the pomp of pow'r,
And all that beauty,
all that wealth e'er gave,
Awaits alike th' inevitable hour,
The paths of glory lead but to the grave.

How trivial human knowledge or wisdom
or skill compared with the omniscience of God
--How frail life itself is compared
with eternity!
