who labor for peace, righteousness, unity, and harmony among our people, and restrain those who would fan the flames and add to our burdens rather than help solve the problems and work constructively toward peace and progress.

O God, give us grace to understand how our lives depend upon the courage, the industry, the honesty, and the integrity of our fellow men; that we may be mindful of their needs, grateful for their fidelity, and faithful in our responsibilities to them. We would indeed make this more than a superficial thing, but we do from our hearts rededicate our lives to Christ our Lord and Master, for we know that this is the way He taught and the way he would have us live.
